**Stanneley.** Richard Skaif surrenders an acre in Stanneley; demised to Robert s. of Ralph de Wakefeld, for 18 years. Entry, 12<sup>d</sup>

Richard Skaif surrenders 15/8 acre in Stanneley; demised to Henry Poket, junior, for 12 years. Entry, 2s

**Stanley.** John Tyting to be distrained to answer William de Sandale & Johanna, his wife, for debt.

**Thornes.** Henry Shiluing acknowledges he entered John de Geirgrave's house in Snaipthorp, & carried off an axe worth 18<sup>d</sup>. He is to make this good; fine, 4<sup>d</sup>
