When Robert de Ketelesthorpe recovered divers tenements in Sandale and Ketelesthorpe against Alice and Margery, daughters of Robert the Ploghwrith, by an attaint taken by 24 jurors before William de Wakefeld, the then Steward, [reversing the verdict of] 12 jurors, taken before John de Danecastre, then and now Steward, the defendants informed the Earl that they suffered injury by being suddenly called upon to answer, without competent and reasonable summons, and also because the attaint was taken by men procured, such as tenants and servants of the said Robert, and tenants of the Parson of Sandale, who are strangers to the tenure of the Earl. The Earl, unwilling that they should suffer injury thereby, ordered John de Danecastre, the now Steward, to do them justice.
