SOUTHOWRAM, a township and village on a lofty eminence above the river Hobble,  $\frac{1}{2}$  miles S.E. of Halifax, in that parish, union, county court district, rural deanery and petty sessional division, Craven archdeaconry, and Ripon diocese. It has 8813 inhabitants and 2646 acres of land, including several scattered hamlets, part of Salterhebble and the celebrated stone and slate quarries of Cromwell Bottom. Waterside, Bank Bottom, Siddall, Salterhebble, and some other parts of the township are in the borough of Halifax. At Chapel le Grove, or Briers, is St. ANNE'S CHURCH, rebuilt in 1619, and containing 560 sittings, of which 120 are free. A new chancel was erected in 1869, at the expense of Mrs. Freeman, of Brier Lodge, who has also inserted three stained-glass windows in memory of her late husband and a son and daughter. A recess of Caen stone and stalls have been erected in the chancel. The church was restored in 1886 at a cost of about £2500. The living is a perpetual curacy, valued at £300 a year, in the patronage of the vicar of Halifax, and incumbency of the Rev. Wm. Davenport, B.A. A Scouting Board was formed in June 1874; Charles S. Sunderland, Esq., of Brightside, is clerk. The Wesleyans, United Methodist Free Church, Primitive Methodists, and Congregationalists, have chapels here. The township is governed by a Local Board, established in 1866, which consists of nine members; Mr. Godfrey Rhodes is clerk, and Mr. Joseph Morton chairman.
